Folks, a few things that happened last night at the Board of Health meeting that Chris and I think can serve as a model for other meetings that are covering potentially contentious issues and helping to control the narrative and get accurate information out there.

- Last night, the Board of Health voted to become the 11th community in the state to adopt nicotine-free generation regulations. Anyone born on or after 1/1/25 will not be able to purchase nicotine products
- In anticipation of a large turnout, we worked with the Board of Health to help ensure it was a smooth meeting so they didn't run into the problems that happened with the electricity choice issue or Jabish Brook building committee.
- We had planned on holding it in the auditorium to accommodate a potentially large group, but when they sent out the official notice they said it was in the Select Board room, so that's where it was held.
- It was standing room only, about 40 people in attendance in the room with another 30 online.
- I helped to manage the GoToMeeting component, which worked out well, it took that burden off of the committee members so they could focus on the issue and discussion.
- The public comment was prioritized by 1) in-person Belchertown residents, then 2) online Belchertown residents, then 3) non-residents in-person then 4) non-residents online. Each speaker was given 3 minutes.
- Each speaker was required to identify themselves and come up to the front of the room, much like town meeting. This really helped to control the comments.
- Immediately following the meeting we wrote a press release that went out this morning to the local and Boston media.
- The press release was [posted on the town's website](#) and a post was done on the town's Facebook page linking to it.
