Subject [Action Requested] Reminder: Tobacco Control in Your Community – Please Take 1 Minute Survey

Dear Health Department Leader,

We hope this message finds you well. Over a dozen jurisdictions in Massachusetts have adopted a Nicotine-Free Generation (NFG) policy that limits the sale of nicotine products to those born after a certain year. These towns include Belchertown, Brookline, Chelsea, Concord, Malden, Manchester, Melrose, Needham, Newton, Pelham, Reading, Somerville, Stoneham, Wakefield, and Winchester.

The Nicotine Free Generation Coalition is assessing local community interest in the policy. Included is a link to a brief survey that should only take a minute to complete. The results will help us effectively reach communities seeking further information regarding the policy and will help prevent unwanted communications to communities not currently interested in considering such a policy. Survey results will ultimately help guide future efforts to support healthier, tobacco-free environments for the youth. Thank you so much for your time and your help!
