Request for Proposals: Post-Overdose Response Team Training in Trauma-Informed Practices (PORT-TIP)
In partnership with CDC, NACCHO is offering a [training and funding opportunity](#) to enhance post-overdose response (PORTs) through trauma-informed approaches and evaluation planning. Selected PORTs will receive funding to complete a 6-week asynchronous online course, engage in virtual training sessions and technical assistance, and develop an evaluation plan to improve team effectiveness, engagement, and outcomes for individuals impacted by overdose. NACCHO Seeks Applications for 2024-2025 Climate and Health Demonstration Sites: Small and Rural Local Health Departments Encouraged to Apply!

NACCHO supports local efforts to track, prevent, and mitigate the health effects of climate change such as local adaptation planning, preparing communities for extreme weather, and all-hazards disaster planning. To this end, NACCHO, with

Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, intends to award up to two (2) entities for up to \$16,000 each to support climate change and health adaptation initiatives at the local level. Local government entities or other local organizations (e.g., community-based organizations) working in climate change and health, or a state, tribal, or territorial government entity proposing a local project with a letter of support from the local government entity are eligible to apply. Address the #PowerofRural: Small and Rural Health Departments Urged to Apply for Funding in Climate Change and Wastewater Surveillance

On National Rural Health Day (November 21), small and rural local health departments (LHDs) are strongly encouraged to consider applying for NACCHO funding to [initiate climate and health adaptation measures](#) (deadline: December 6) and [implement wastewater surveillance through peer-to-peer mentorship](#) (deadline: December 6).

- * As rural LHDs prepare to build a climate-ready rural workforce with the help of NACCHO's [practical guide](#), funding and health funding opportunity paves the way for many recommendations in the guide to be mobilized.
- * NACCHO's Wastewater Surveillance (WWS) Mentorship Program, now in its fourth year, will provide rural LHDs an opportunity to learn from peers who have faced similar but unique circumstances in their own jurisdictions, from the physical distance between laboratories, wastewater treatment plants, and other components of WWS. NACCHO is committed to at least one pairing (one mentor and two mentees) of rural jurisdictions in the 2025 WWS mentorship program.
