NACCHO CEO Lori Tremmel Freeman on LHD Initiatives During Suicide Prevention Awareness Month

NACCHO offers our deepest gratitude to all local health department staff, community and government partners, advocates, and individuals who are working to prevent suicide. September 1, 2023, marks the start of Suicide Prevention Awareness Month. Throughout this month, NACCHO honors those lost from suicide, acknowledges the profound grief experienced by the families of those whose lives have been lost, and recognizes those working to prevent suicide in their communities. According to the CDC, an estimated 47,000 people are lost to suicide in the United States between 2011 and 2022. Rates of suicide deaths are on the rise, and tragically, the trend is continuing. Provisional data indicate that the trend is continuing with the reporting of 49,369 suicide deaths. These numbers do not account for non-fatal attempts, those who have experienced suicidal thoughts, those who have seriously considered suicide, or those who have made a plan—which further increases the risk of suffering of many Americans. NACCHO and the U.S. Breastfeeding Committee's Continuity of Care Constellation launched the [Continuity of Care in Breastfeeding: A Blueprint for Communities](#). The goal of the CoC Blueprint is to support local-level organizations or individuals working with pregnant and postpartum families to ensure coordinated transitions of care and create supportive environments throughout their breastfeeding journey. With support from the CDC Division of Nutrition, Physical Activity, and Obesity, NACCHO is announcing a funding opportunity to support the implementation of the CoC Blueprint to strengthen community-level breastfeeding support. Applicants are required to apply with at least two key partners to implement strategies from at least three recommended activities in the CoC Blueprint. Applicants can also select additional activities to improve the community's child nutrition security and breastfeeding culture. NACCHO will select up to five local organizations that will each receive an award of up to \$50,000. Applications are due no later than October 1, 2023, at 11:59 PM PST. Year 2 of the State and Local Cybersecurity Grant Program

The Department of Homeland Security has announced the availability of \$374.9 million in grant funding for the Fiscal Year 2023 State and Local Cybersecurity Grant Program (SLCGP). Now in its second year, the SLCGP is a first-of-its-kind cybersecurity grant program specifically for state, local, and territorial (SLT) governments across the country to help them strengthen their cybersecurity. SLCGP provides \$1 billion in funding over four years to support SLT governments as they develop capabilities to detect, prevent, and respond to cyber threats. [Learn more and apply here.](#)
