Key Features of the Program:

1. Text and Phone Coaching

- Youth participants receive support from live coaches trained in working with teens.
- Coaching sessions are available through text messaging or phone calls, making the program accessible and private.

2. Personalized Quit Plan

- Coaches help participants create customized plans based on their specific needs, goals, and challenges.

3. Confidential Support

- The program ensures confidentiality to encourage teens to seek help without fear of judgment or exposure.

4. Access to Tools and Resources

- Youth can log their progress and access information to manage cravings, cope with stress, and build healthier habits.

5. Multilingual Services

- Support is available in English and Spanish to accommodate diverse populations
