

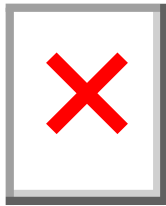

In the fat times, it's easy to be a university president.

You shake down wealthy alumni and pretend their donations aren't buying admission for their dim offspring. You learn to breathe through your mouth to endure the bad breath of senior faculty and poor student hygiene, and take their perpetual complaints under advisement, a process similar to what Black Earth Compost does with your table scraps after they pickup your little green barrel.

And as long as the bucks keep flowing and you manage to avoid antagonizing the board of trustees, you're golden.

But these are not the days of wine and roses for academia, public or private. Dozens of public or nonprofit colleges have folded or are on the brink of it since the pandemic hit. **The Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia** forecasts another 80 could bite the dust this year as costs soar and enrollments drop.

And now, **Trump**, taking a chainsaw to the federal funding that's been the mother's milk of higher education around here for decades. What's a college president to do beyond waving goodbye as Mr. Chips cashes his chips in?

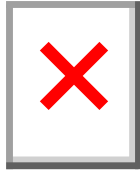
If you're **Marty Meehan**, arguably -- along with the late **Paul Tsongas** -- the most influential son of Lowell since **Jack Kerouac**, you do what you've always done: take Trump's broken eggs and make egg salad out of them.

Building on the work of Tsongas and others to build federal funding pipelines to Lowell and the **UMass** campus there, Meehan took over as UMass-Lowell chancellor in 2007 and went on a fundraising and spending binge that propelled the school to unheard-of regional and national rankings, with a special emphasis on technology and life sciences.

Now in his tenth year as president of the entire UMass system, Meehan has a new gambit he's touting: climate tech, the fast-growing universe of scientific and technological solutions to environmental and social issues raised by climate change...

Rep. Vaughn on asking feds for support

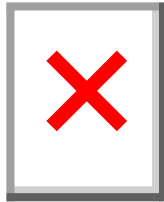
Wrentham Republican **Rep. Marcus Vaughn** said that he has been in contact with the **Trump administration** in an attempt to ask for more funding support in Massachusetts.

"We've had some good conversations with his administration and I've asked for some of the secretaries and undersecretaries to come here and speak to myself and members of the Republican caucus," Vaugh said in an interview that aired Sunday.

"They are slashing federal funding and it does affect the core of Bay Staters. So we have to get to a point where we mend those bridges and allow them to see what's happening as a result of those cuts," he continued.

Vaughn told hosts "On the Record" that he does not support cuts to **Medicaid**; that he's still against the Trump administration's allowance of **ICE** enforcement in or near schools and churches; and that he has mixed opinions about the House budget funding to the attorney general's office, which has been extensively fighting **President Trump** in court.

"I understand the cause on the forefront because of the uneasiness and lack of control we have right now. But I also think it's part of our own doing, with the executive office fighting with our federal partners," Vaugh said, suggesting leaders could "sit down at the table" to get a "mutual understanding" about what's going on in Massachusetts and across the country. — **WCVB**

Boston City Councilor **Tania Fernandes Anderson** is set to make an appearance in court on Monday, where she's expected to plead guilty to federal corruption charges — one count of wire fraud and one count of theft involving public funds. Fernandes Anderson has not yet officially

resigned, but the hearing comes about one month after the councilor agreed to sign a plea deal and announced her undated resignation plans. — [NBC10](#)

Trump again threatens to remove Harvard's tax-exempt status

President Donald Trump wrote Friday that he will pull **Harvard University's** tax-exempt status — a move Harvard President **Alan Garber** [told](#) the *Wall Street Journal* Friday would be "highly illegal" and "destructive to Harvard." It isn't clear yet whether the IRS has already taken action to do so, but the Friday threat is the second time Trump has floated the idea. Harvard has been one of the first universities to stand against the **Trump administration** and its reach into institutions of higher education. — [Harvard Crimson](#)

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Exporters fear trade war with China

Massachusetts exporters are among companies poised to suffer in a trade war with China, even amid popular attention to China's status as a major source of imports, the Globe's Omar Mohammed reports. MGM head leaves future of Springfield casino open to discussion

The head of **MGM Resorts International** stopped short of saying "no" when recently asked by a stock analyst whether the company would consider "monetizing assets," or selling properties such as MGM Springfield, MassLive's Jim Kinney reports. To the question from **Morgan Stanley's Stephen Grambling, William Hornbuckle** said: "Remember, I suspect you do, that Northfield Park and Springfield are ongoing discussions.
