UNESCO: Glacial melt threatens water supplies

Friday, March 21, marked the United Nations' inaugural World Day for Glaciers, and the event coincided with the release of a UNESCO report highlighting glacial loss trends. Study: Rapid subsidence raising flood risk in Hawaii

Researchers at the University of Hawaii at Manoa found that parts of the Hawaiian island of Oahu are experiencing relatively rapid subsidence, which can worsen flood risk due to sea level rise. Some areas of Oahu were sinking by about 25 millimeters per year, nearly 40 times the island-wide subsidence rate, the researchers found. "In places like the Mapunapuna industrial region, subsidence could increase flood exposure area by over 50% by 2050, while compressing flood preparedness timelines by up to 50 years," study co-author Phil Thompson said. **Full Story:** [Popular Mechanics \(3/18\)](#)

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WMO: Over \$4.3T lost to climate events since 1970

Extreme weather and water events driven by climate change caused more than two million deaths and \$4.3 trillion in losses from 1970 to 2021, the World Meteorological Organization reports, noting that close to half of the world's countries still lack comprehensive early warning systems despite advances in forecasting technology. "Early warnings are not luxuries. They are necessities and sound investments -- providing an almost tenfold return," UN Secretary-
