Good Speed by Design: A Network Approach to Traffic Calming

The Dutch cycling network extends for 35,000 km (21,700 miles) – a substantial network with roughly the size and population of New Jersey. Yet only about a third of this system is physically separated from motorized traffic, which is concentrated along faster, higher-order road links. How is the rest of the network made safe for people cycling, especially the oldest and youngest in society (who cycle at the highest rates)? This course reviews the most common techniques, including some that are not usually obvious to road users themselves, and situates them within the overarching logic and objectives of Dutch traffic calming.
