If you are receiving this email it is because you have been involved in some capacity in our efforts to pass an NFG regulation at the local level.

My apologies if you receive duplicate emails – that means you are on more than one email distribution list. Trying our best to get the word out to everyone. This came sooner than I expected but as you will see in the email below, the NFG bill in the State House will be the subject of a Hearing next Monday.

We've made terrific progress on the local level – 17 municipalities have adopted an NFG regulation so far, covering more than 500,000 Massachusetts residents.

Several other municipalities are in some stage of considering NFG.

It's extremely important that we let our legislators know our position on this groundbreaking policy. Please consider in-person testimony if at all possible. And written testimony if you can't attend the hearing in person. I know we are not all able to pull that off!

Please let me know if you have any questions, especially those of you who are municipal or state employees and concerned about "lobbying" versus "educating" our legislators. Since the hearing involves a specific state bill, or bills, there are some restrictions. We can all educate any time. And we can lobby on our own time.

Hope to see you all at the State House next week though I realize it is short notice and a big vacation week. If you can't attend in person please consider written testimony. Thank you!

The Joint Committee on Public Health will conduct a hybrid public hearing in Hearing Room A1 on July 14, 2025, from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. on bills relating to children's health, tobacco, health information technology and professional licensure and scope of practice.

Individuals testifying should limit their remarks to 3 minutes. All panels should limit their testimony to a total of 6 minutes.

Please be advised that all written testimony submitted will be read by Committee Members and staff and may be made publicly available at the discretion of the Chairs. The committee may limit availability or redact testimony that includes sensitive personal information or information that may jeopardize the health, wellness, or safety of the testifier or others.

All matters filed in the House that are listed below are required to be reported on by September 8, 2025, subject to extensions consistent with House Rule 27.

DEADLINE TO PRE-REGISTER: Persons planning to testify virtually must sign up no later than **5:00 p.m. on Thursday, July 10, 2025**. Individuals and groups testifying in person are strongly encouraged to register using the form above prior to the deadline.

Registration by the deadline is required for those who wish to testify virtually during the live hearing and encouraged for those who wish to testify in person. Persons who do not have a Google account or do not wish to use the Google form can submit testimony and/or sign up to testify by emailing JointCommittee.PublicHealth@malegislature.gov. Please indicate whether you plan to testify in person or virtually. Participants who indicate that they plan to testify virtually will receive an invitation to the hearing with instructions via email after the deadline closes.
