My friend Bonny Carroll is the Tobacco Program Director for Somerville/Cambridge/Chelsea/Everett/Revere/Winthrop.

Somerville adopted NFG this past spring. I understand from Bonny that the Cambridge Assistant City Solicitor is looking at trying to change the Tobacco sales regs from a city ordinance to a BOH regulation. That would potentially smooth the way for adoption of NFG. Cambridge is generally a leader in public health innovation. Hope to see them come on board. That would be a huge add.

We currently have 500,000 residents in 17 communities covered by NFG. Need to reach critical mass in order for there to be a good chance that the Legislature would pass a State-wide bill. Fingers crossed.

Let me know if you have any interest in joining our grassroots group.

But whether or not you do I would love to meet for coffee some time to keep up the connections to our MA Heroines Class of 2025. So many interesting and accomplished women I would not have met except for this powerful event. (I'm already thinking of potential candidates for my State Senator and my State Rep to consider nominating next year.)

Let's meet in person. Melrose is not far from Cambridge. I love Cambridge. I go there for protests!
