Hi Ken -

It is a discussion only, not a hearing. As I understand it from Bonny, the purpose is to discuss other proposed amendments to the city's tobacco regulations and NOT NFG. However, Bonny reported that the local NPR affiliate (either WGBH or WBUR) reported that tonight's meeting will discuss a "tobacco ban." This wording suggests that our opponents are trying to create negative interest by sending the station this news scoop.

City councilor Ben Ewen-Campen posted this on his Facebook page:
